We hold classes, demonstrations, workshops, life drawing, exhibitions and plein air events.



# Hambledon Cottage Bicentenary 14th April 2024

EN Smith from Parramatta and District Historical Society invited us to join the bicentenary celebration of Hambledon Cottage, once owned by pioneers John and



Elizabeth Macarthur, founders of the wool industry in Australia.

The CPAS has an historical link to the cottage, more particularly to the coach house, where during the late 1960's through to 1975, Parramatta Art Society's classes, meetings, workshops and demonstrations were held.

It was a bright sunny day. Food and craft stalls, historic tours, house tours, music, pipe band and dancing, all within the grounds of the beautiful historic cottage. Red Coats marched and the Town Cryer rang his bell. In our small marquee we displayed our members' loose works and also as many of our small \$45 paintings that we could fit in. We spoke to many people about the art society and handed out our brochures and managed to sell 9 small paintings in the process.

John Hallam, with a small group of CPAS members sat at the tables under an ancient oak, painting and sketching the cottage. They created a lot of interest and received plenty of praise and admiration. This was our first organised plein air event pre covid. It was amazing!

Many thanks to Ken and the Historical Society for including the CPAS in their celebrations. It was a wonderful day.

# Flowers in Pastels

Demonstration by Greg Hansell on March 16th, 2024

Greg arrived with flowers from his garden, which he placed in a colourful ginger jar.

He began with a sheet of pastel paper, which was a deep mauve colour sketched the subject in with a conte pencil.





Greg uses schminke pastels, which he says you can pastel over as many times as you like, his idea is never put down one colour when you can use half a dozen.

He paints loosely and quickly, starting at the top of the painting with the flowers, adding the background at the same time, he has a good eye and gets everything right from the first time.

He added the ginger jar, with light and shade painted sensatively, he lightened the background around the jar, and it all came together.

He also gave us some tips.

- He uses 3 different shades of black.
- To make green, he puts down a black first then adds yellow.
- You need a light, medium and dark of every colour.
- If you want to light up something, put a dark colour around it.

Greg finished with a lovely painting, which he then graceously gave to our society to use for a raffle.



## Seascape in water miscible oils

Demonstration by Bob Gurney on April 20th, 2024

OB brought a stretched canvas, covered in a burnt sienna colour, with acrylic paint. On top of this he was using water miscible oils for this demonstration.

He explained that he uses 3 cool clours and 3 warm colours:

Burnt sienna, sap green, raw sienna - warm colours and his cool colours - ultramarine blue, lemon yellow, alizarin red plus white.

Bob also uses a medium called water soluble, which helps the paint to go on smoothly.

The scene was of a photo he took, of a stomy sky over Coledale.

He sketched the scene loosely with a paint brush, then he started to paint the sky, with a purple mixture of blue and red with a touch of yellow, and continued with a little white.

He continued adding more

of the same colours, until the sky was done.

Next he put the darks in the landscape with thin paint. After wiping the brush he added white to the ocean area with some of the previous colour coming through on his brush.

He explained that by using only 3 colours you get a harmony through the painting.

The audience admired the colours of his painting.

He painted the sand on the beach with red and yellow, but different mixtures, and he grayed the distance by adding a little blue.

The surf was added with a fine brush in thick white and a little yellow.

He worked on the grassy areas at sands edge with green and red, then he painted around trees on the headland, and added impressions of rooftops

with white mix.

He refined all the different areas to bring the painting to a nice finish.

Bob worked on the painting a bit more on the next day and has sent me a photo of it completed.

A very nice painting.
