


her nature. Even when she was so ill and in constant pain, she was always concerned about the health and wellbeing of those around her



### A Palette of Artistic Journey, Awards, and Reflections An Interview with Colina Grant

Join us for an insightful interview with Colina Grant, where she delves into her artistic journey, guided by interviewer Vicky Anne Gatt. From her early days at the National Art School to teaching and experimentation with pastels, Colina shares pivotal moments, reflections on awards, and the impact of Parramatta Art Society on her career.

Don't miss this captivating glimpse into the life of an accomplished artist.

## What were your early artistic influences?

Encouraged by parents and most teachers I won a scholarship to admit me into the National Art School and at the same time also found a position in a City Commercial Art Studio, where I worked during the semester breaks. After a year of doing this, my boss suggested that I forego my scholarship and come to work full time and attend college in the evenings. This wasn't taxing at all.... doing what I love (and getting paid for it!) and continuing to be taught my chosen subjects by Australia's best art teachers just up the hill in Darlinghurst from where I worked through the day! I'm so indebted to those teachers.....some of their words stay with me to this day. I think the BIG thing I learnt doing commercial work was to be quick, as most jobs that came in would be wanted yesterday!

# How did you balance your art with Family Life?

As marriage and family came along, I left the studio but continued doing free-lance and resumed my studies in the evenings once the babies were tucked in. The College was within walking distance of home.....once again.... perfect! I consider this period as my most creative and owe inspiration to my teacher at the time.

# Do you have a favourite medium, and how did you discover it?

I began entering competitions and was encouraged by success. My husband bought me a small pack of pastels and I began experimenting with them, using them, initially as a drawing medium, then gradually 'painting' with them. There was little or no books and certainly no teachers, so it was trial and error, but I discovered pastel lends itself very well to experimentation. Entering competitions at that time there were no sections accommodating the medium which was frustrating. But finally, societies and groups discovered the many beautiful ways pastel could be rendered.

## Have you ever taught art or mentored others?

Yes, and it was always pastel that I would be requested to demonstrate or teach and it wasn't long before groups were inviting me to teach from as far north as Cairns, south to Melbourne. west to Dubbo and east to New Zealand. I was teaching for the Parramatta College (27 years) and running a sketch club for the same length of time. I can't impress the importance of this aspect to freeing up the hand and increasing observation.....I was doing it from the age of 15 and owe much to it, I'm sure. I was also conducting private classes for children and adults at home. Not sure how I fitted in workshops 'away' sometimes for a week at a time but mostly just a weekend, But I did, and kept a diary of it all!

### How long have you been a member of The City of Parramatta Art Society?

I joined the Art Society in 1970 after moving back into the Parramatta district once again, with the intent to learn from my elders and wasn't disappointed! Recently, when the society was



turning 70, I suggested a book should be written and got voted for the job! Being able to read through the boxes of archives coincided with covid restrictions and I had great pleasure discovering those early years before I joined and re-living the others.

# Tell us about the awards and recognition you have received:

The art societys association with the Combined Art Societies of Sydney allowed me to be presented with "Artist of the Year" 10 times and the Pastel Society of Australia also awarded me "Master Pastellist" and the Royal Art Society of NSW made me a "Fellow".

All these awards cannot take precedence over the camaraderie of friendship formed from these travels over the years.

### Demonstration Report Ruhullah Naqshbandi - Portrait in Oils

Ruhullah conducted a captivating demonstration of portrait painting in oils, revealing his skillful technique and thoughtful color palette choices.

At the outset, he introduced his preferred colors, including Ultramarine, Cobalt, Ceruleum blue for blues, Alizarin and Cadmium red for reds, a light green for greens, and Titanium white.

The demonstration commenced with Ruhullah applying a grey mixture broadly across the canvas using a large brush, which he then smoothed and softened with a paper towel. Carefully observing the model, he delicately outlined the head using a small brush.







Progressing to the face, Rahula artfully incorporated dark warm colors, consistently refining the features while keeping his chosen colors close together at the centre of his palette.

Moving on to the shoulders and bodice, Ruhullah employed a

palette knife to introduce a light grey, artfully blended to maintain emphasis on the facial details.

To enhance unity, he integrated some of the portrait's colors into the grey background.

The audience remained captivated throughout the demonstration, witnessing Ruhullah's adept development of the portrait.

A job well done, leaving the spectators enthralled by his artistic prowess.
